## Open Government Partnership




- Established in 2011 on the 'fringes' of the United Nations
- Role to provide an international platform to promote transparency, empower citizens, fight corruption and harness new technologies
- Aim to advance the ideals of open and participatory 21st century government


The Open Government Partnership (OGP) is operating in politically challenging times for a community dedicated to advancing openness and democracy. Over the past two years, all of us at OGP have observed the rise of authoritarianism, populist rhetoric, misinformation, and attacks on civic space in OGP and non-OGP countries alike. Yet the advances we have made at the global, country, and thematic levels are a sign that there is still a critical mass of countries committed to open government. OGP welcomed eight new governments in 2018, bringing us to 99 national and local governments.



## NZ has a high international openness rating

- √ Transparency International Corruption Perceptions Index: 2<sup>nd</sup>
- ✓2018 Democracy Index: 4<sup>th</sup> out of 167 countries
- ✓ Freedom in the World: 100% for freedom, political rights and civil liberties
- ✓ World Bank's Worldwide Governance Indicators: almost at 100%
- ✓ Open Budget Index: 1st equal with South Africa

#### But NZ could do better

- ➤Global Right to Information Rating: NZ rated 51st out of 123 countries
- >2018 Democracy Index: political participation: 8.89; political culture 8.13
- Transparency International NZ: Parliament still needs to consider its own processes and practices
- ➤ 2018 Open Budget Index: NZ's participation rated at 59%
- ➤ 2018 World Press Freedom Index: media pluralism and independence in NZ under constant threat with consequential transparency risks
- ➤ 2017 general election: people aged under 40 were nearly half of those enrolled who did not vote

## IRM New Zealand End-of-term report 2014-2016

"The New Zealand government made some improvements to access to information and civic participation. The government released new datasets and consulted CSOs on public engagement practices. However, the government's process falls short of OGP's co-creation guidelines, the commitments lacked clear activities for implementation, and the gains were marginal. With the next action plan, the government could focus on creating opportunities for stakeholders to be involved in implementing commitments."



### But little or no progress to:

- Fully reform official information legislation
- Include local government in the OGP programme
- Trial participatory budgeting
- Trial citizens' assemblies
- Adopt the international Open Contracting Standard
- Review political party donations
- Link up with NZ's work on the UN Sustainable Development Goals

For long-term major impact:

NZ must add open government performance to public sector chief executives' contracts and to the new well-being indicators

Work with civil society to enable long-term meaningful co-creation and implementation of OGP commitments
