

#### Pasifika Peoples in New Zealand

- ★ Seven main island groups Samoa, Cook Is, Tonga, Niue, Fiji, Tokelau, Tuvalu
- Cook Is, Niue, Tokelau constitutional relationship with NZ
- Migration in 60s -70s in response to NZ demand for labour
- Majority in South & West Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch
- Majority NZ born (62 per cent)
- Young population



## **Median Age**

#### Māori & Pacific peoples are youthful populations


- The median age (50% are younger & 50% are older, than this age) was lower for Māori and Pacific peoples than for European & Asian ethnic groups.
- The median age for each ethnic group:
  - European 41.0 years
  - Māori 23.9 years
  - Pacific peoples 22.1 years
  - Asian 30.6 years.

# Median Income – What this means for most Pasifika families

- ★ Transport to VUW can be a challenge both
   by car and public transport
- \* Fewer families own their own homes
- ★ Families and generations living in houses designed for smaller families cost of rental housing lack of quiet study space
- Lower decile schools pre-tertiary education
- Cost of Heating, Clothing, Nutrition & Health
- Less access to internet and broadband
- Tuition fees and Text books
- Access to technology




# What do we know about Pacific cultures generally?

- **Relationships** are the societal glue
- Diverse groups
- Similar but different cultural values and protocols
- Reciprocity & Obligation are key core values
- > Place high value on 'Family', Spirituality, Church and Pastor
- \* Take time to understand & come to a consensus
- Motivated by individuality within a wider sense of communitarianism
- May pay greater respect to the authority & status specific to their nation (Matai, Aiga, Wantok)

# What Pasifika young people say works for them

- Need a responsive environment

- ☆ Good if we get to know everyone in the group
- ★ Some people need ideas to be brought out of them. Louder ones share their ideas anyway
- Need tutors/lecturers to be affirming −
   'That idea is good, have you thought about ....'
- We know we need to expand our borders beyond the Pacific 'world'
- We still need to tell our own stories, to see people we can identify with, relate to
