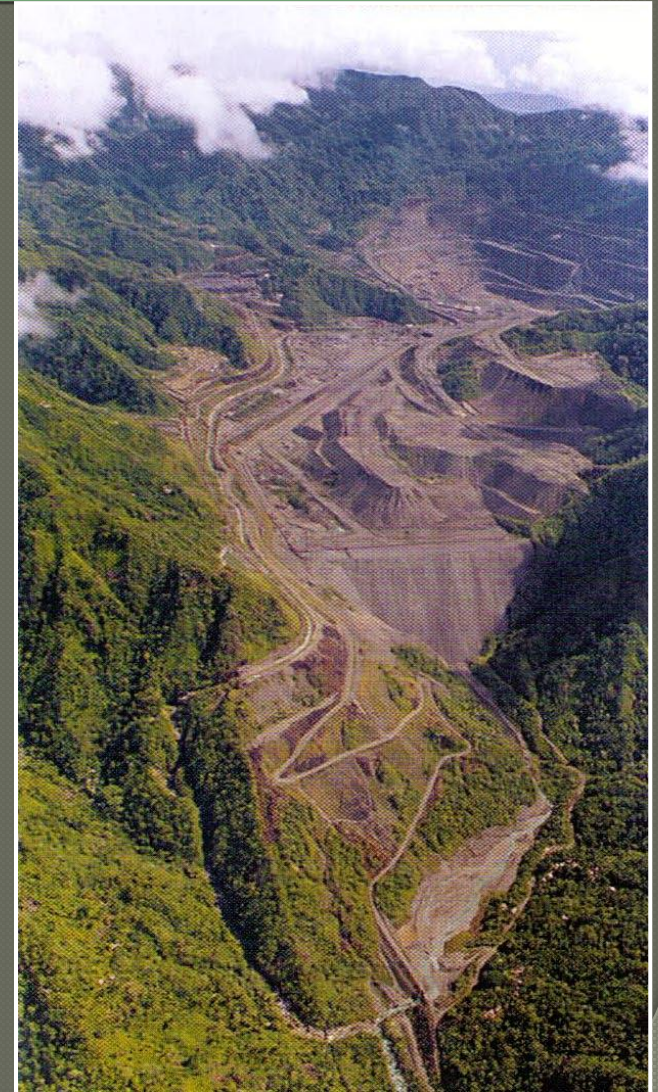

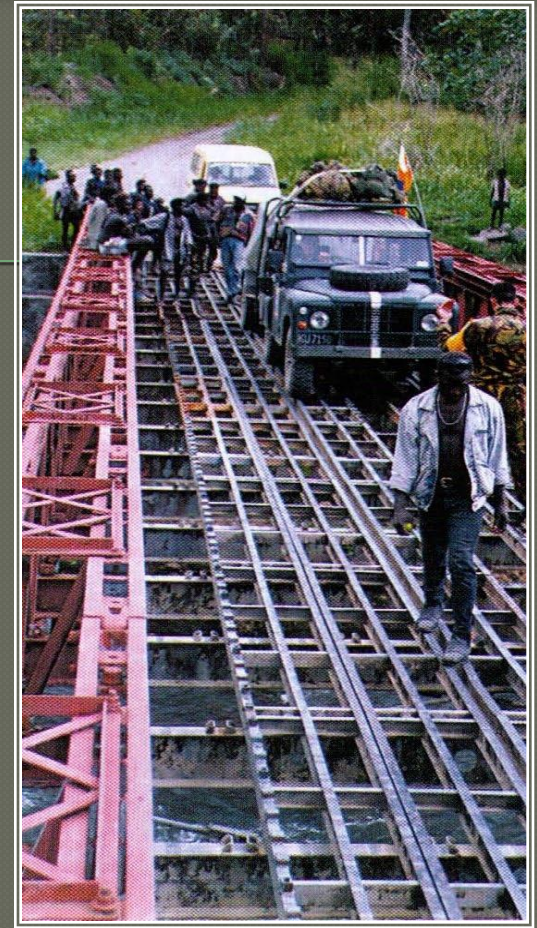
1. 10 Years of Civil War. 1988-1997.

- ◉ Cause: The Panguna Copper Mine.
- ◉ Triangular Civil War.
- ◉ Blockaded Island –
no medical drugs.
- ◉ Destruction of all
Infrastructure.
- ◉ Population: 234,280.
Killed: 15,000 – 20,000



No Infrastructure

- Whole Towns destroyed.
- Hospital and Post/telephone exchange destroyed.
- Petrol stations destroyed.
- Bridges' decking removed.
- Markets/ shops not functioning.
- Schools/ churches not functioning.
- No imported medicinal drugs.
- People afraid to congregate.



- Australian initiated.
- Sometimes NZ assisted.
- Conventional – based on UN philosophy

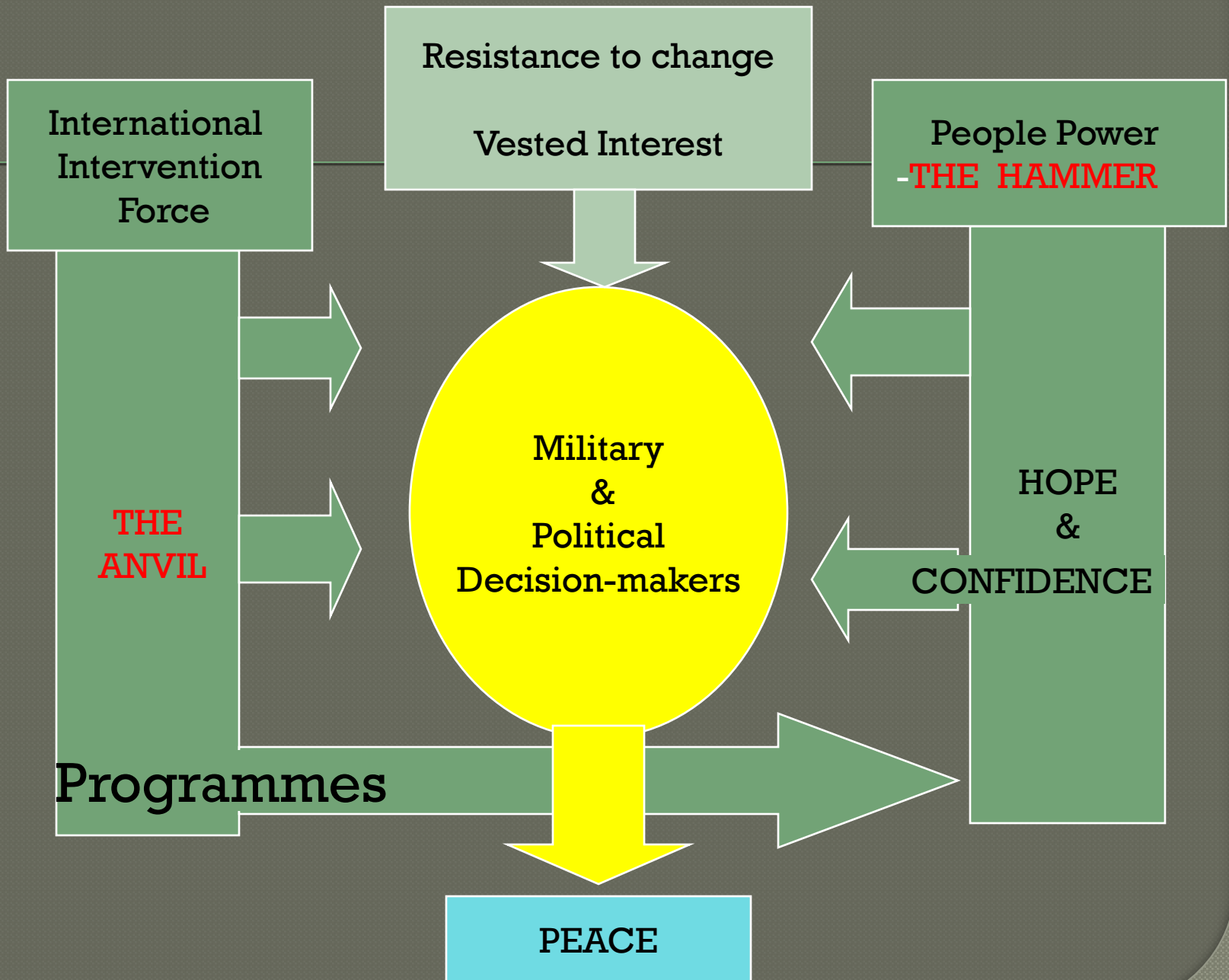

What did the Troops think?

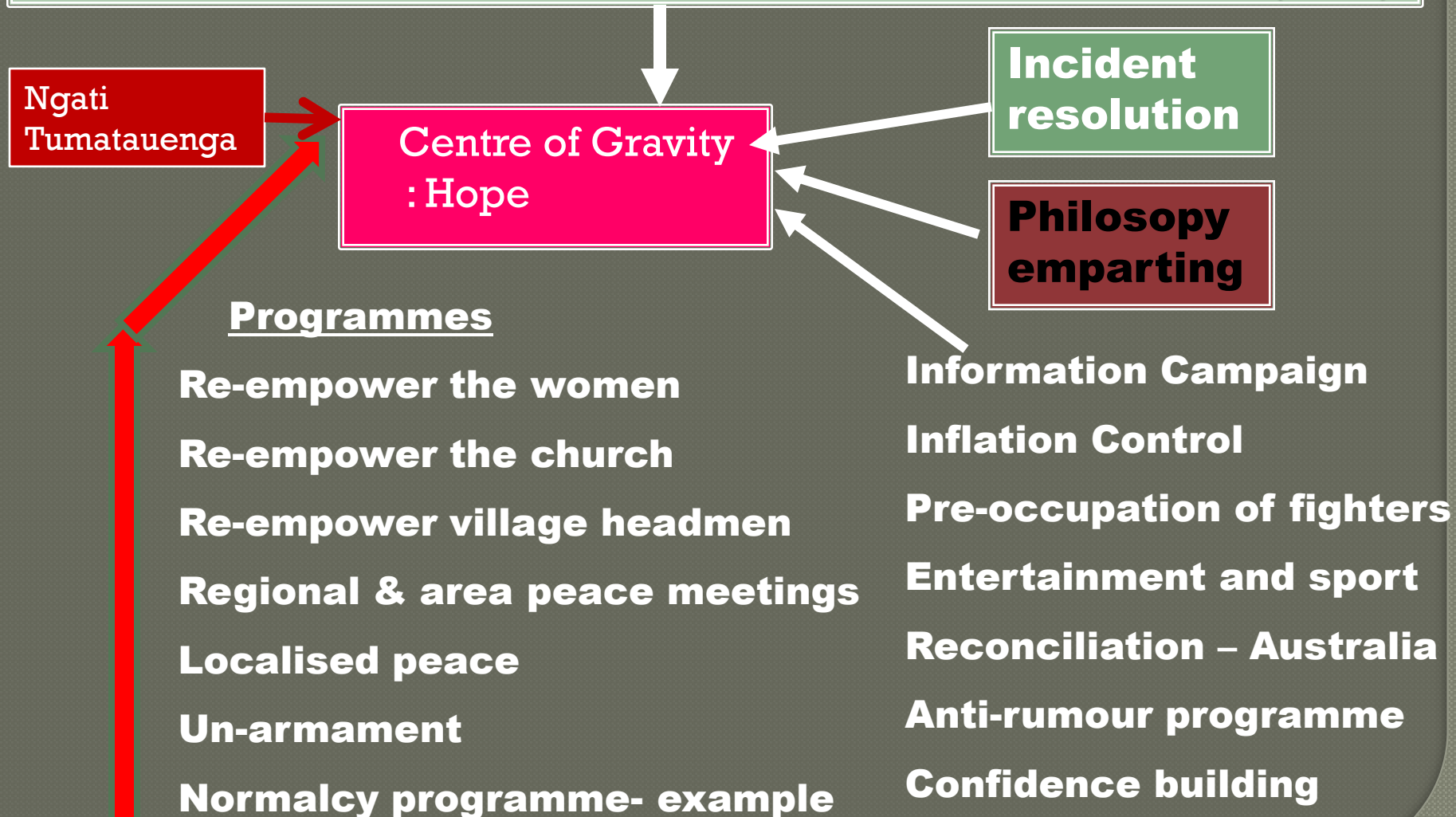
- *“When you looked at the country brief, you knew that you were not going into a benign environment. It actually was hostile.*

Strategy: To create and sustain an environment to ensure a successful peace process by promoting people power and using it to squeeze the decision-makers between the people and the overseas witnesses (TMG).



4. The Peace Agreement.

- High' Autonomy (Bougainville's political status)
- 'Fiscal self-reliance' for Bougainville.
- Public service, courts, police and prisons.
- Weapons Disposal/Decommissioning .
- Amnesty, pardon and reconciliation.
- (Deferred) referendum on Bougainville's future political status

5. Ambition versus economic reality.

- Small country – not an economic unit.
- Misplaced in post-colonial re-organisation.
- Ambitious for independence.
- Independence could set a precedent for other unhappy provinces of PNG.
- Minerals (currently un-mined) tempting to PNG Government.
- China and Indonesia are watching.

6. REFERENDUM Due 23 November 2019

- The date will be subject to the implementation of the **weapons disposal** plan and the autonomous Bougainville government's achieving an appropriate standard of '**good governance**' (taking account of internationally accepted standards of democracy, transparency, accountability, and respect for human rights) as agreed with the national government. The outcome of the referendum will be **subject to ratification by the final decision-making authority: the National Parliament.**

Current Problems

- ◉ Corruption.
- ◉ Inadequate income for an independent state (Has achieved only 6% of needs.)
- ◉ Lack of unity.
- ◉ Referendum proposes losers only to all sides.
- ◉ Justice? [versus Reconciliation]
- ◉ Disarmament ??????

What will happen?

- ◉ Options:
- ◉ The referendum will or will not be held.
- ◉ The people will vote for independence or greater autonomy.
- ◉ Will the PNG Government ratify an independence vote?
- ◉ If not, will the Bougainvilleans accept non-ratification? What could they do?
- ◉ Is there a prospect of war again?

Bougainville referendum could spark regional crisis

- “If the people of Bougainville vote for independence and are unable to reach agreement with the government of Papua New Guinea, the Bougainville issue may precipitate another regional crisis,” warned analyst Ben Bohane, author of a study by the Lowy Institute, an Australian think tank.

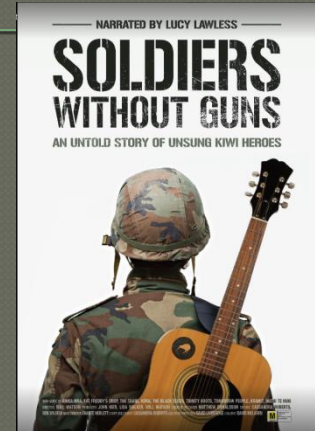
